TO: All Bidders

It is the responsibility of the Bidder to verify that they have received all addenda in respect to the project bid. It is recommended that the Bidder contact Carter & Sloope, Inc.'s project engineer (who is handling this bid) no later than 48 hours before the bid time to confirm the total number of addenda issued. The project engineers can be reached with the above contact information.

It is the Bidder's responsibility to download all addenda from QuestCDN. Downloading addenda serves as acknowledgement of said addenda. **Failure to download all addenda shall constitute an incomplete and non-conforming bid which will not be read aloud.**

PART I. CLARIFICATIONS

- A. QUESTIONS & ANSWERS: Please see below answers to questions received to date, including those asked during the pre-bid meeting. **Questions asked but not answered here will be resolved via a future Addendum.**

Q: The existing breaker size for the Facility Pump Station Is 125A while the proposed breaker size is 250A. Can the spares in the local cabinet be used for the new breaker?

A: Yes, specifically the 18” space at the top of Section 9 of the local cabinet can be used for the new 250A breaker.

Q: On Sheet 5, the grit screw appears to be on a slab. The plan does not say pour a slab, and currently no slab exists under it. Is a slab being poured for the new grit screw?

A: No, the new grit screw shall replace the existing screw in the same location and be installed in the same manner.

Q: Spec section 02500 has several references/requirements for concrete pipe, but my understanding is that the yard piping on this project is all DIP. Is the intention for any pipe on this project to be concrete pipe?

A: No proposed pipe on this project is intended to be concrete pipe. This spec covers multiple pipe materials, not all applicable to this project. Refer to Plan Drawings for direction on pipe materials required for this project.

Q: Who is the provider of the air compressor equipment on Sheet 14?

A: Cowart Air Compressor, Inc. out of Valdosta, Georgia. Our contact is Dusty Cowart, cac@cowart-inc.net.

Q: Sheet 15 says that the piping and supports for the air compressor system are to be provided by contractor, however 15063-2.01C2/D1 seems to indicate that they are provided by the manufacturer. Please advise.

A: All direct components related to the air compressor system – air compressor units, piping, dryer, and tank – **shall be provided by the manufacturer.**

Q: Can the grit chamber isolated from the existing processes to facilitate the change-out?

A: Yes, existing slide gates can be used to isolate the grit chamber.

Q: Per Sheet 4, will the trailer mounted pumps and associated piping be supplied by the Owner?

A: Yes, the Owner shall provide pumps and associated piping connecting to the new permanent piping being installed by the Contractor.

Q: How will the 6" concrete cap be installed at the abandoned clarifiers?

A: The concrete cap shall be installed on top of the existing concrete, not between or with the existing concrete.

Q: Are the 3 variable frequency drives to be replaced on Sheet 15 outside of the electrical drawings?

A: Yes, they will be furnished according to Sheet 15 and the price included in the Miscellaneous Improvements Bid Item.

Q: Can the conduit from the electrical room to RAS/WAS pumps station be routed south of Clarifier #2?

A: Contractors shall price this work as currently shown in the Bid Documents. If desired, alternate routing can be evaluated post-bid.

Q: Who is responsible for paying for construction testing?

A: Contractor is responsible for construction testing expenses. Disregard Specification Section 01400, paragraph 1.6.A that indicates the Owner will employ the testing firm. **Contractor shall submit for approval the testing firm being used prior to construction.**

Q: Is a geotechnical report available for the site?

A: No, there is not a geotechnical report available.

Q: Regarding undercut per Specification 02300-9(C), what depth should the contractor assume for bidding purposes? Should the 24" minimum noted for highly plastic soils be used as a general assumption, or will undercut be determined in the field?

A: The 24" minimum undercut depth shall be used as a general assumption for this scenario.

Q: Referencing spec section 03201-2.1A; is the rebar on this project required to be galvanized or epoxy coated?

A: No; furthermore, Spec Section 3201 was included in error and shall be removed from the Bid Documents. Refer to Section 3200 regarding concrete reinforcement requirements.

Q: If there is no Geotech report/soil borings, can we assume that the soil excavated will be suitable for backfill for bidding purposes?

A: Yes, assume excavated soil will be suitable for backfill.

Q: Is Section 00484 to be submitted with our bid proposal or after?

A: Section 00484 will be submitted after a Contractor's bid proposal.

Q: Are the project references to be included as part of specification section 00470 – Qualifications of Bidder, to be submitted after the bid?

A: Section 00470 and project references will be submitted after the bid.

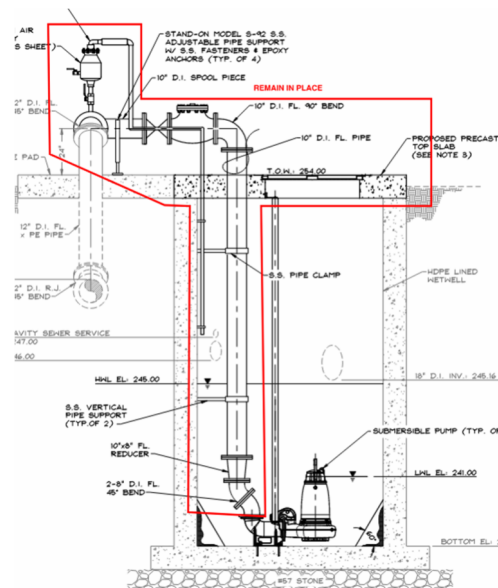

PART II. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS AND TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

- A. SECTION 00410 – BIDDER’S REPRESENTATIONS & CERTIFICATIONS:
Please find attached to this Addendum revised Section 00410, to be signed and uploaded as a required part of a Contractor’s Bid. Section 00410 – Basis of Bid shall be removed from the Bid Documents.
- B. SECTION 11205 – WAS PUMPING SYSTEM: The following corrections shall be made to this Spec Section:
1. 2.8.B. Panel Enclosure, Paragraph 1 – “Electrical control equipment shall be mounted within a 304 Stainless Steel **NEMA 1X** panel.”
 2. 2.8.C Branch Components, Paragraph 3. Motor Starter – **Variable Frequency Drives will be provided.**
 3. 2.8.G Control Circuit, Paragraph 3. – “Control logic shall be accomplished using programmable logic controller (PLC) **provided independently for each pump with control provided directly via Plant SCADA.**

PART III. PLAN DRAWINGS

- A. DRAWING SHEET NO. 13 – FACILITY PUMP STATION MODIFICATIONS
PLAN & SECTION: Per the marked snippet below, the existing valves, piping, wetwell top, and hatch shall remain in place; **only the submersible pumps (w/ associated electrical components), guide rails, and base elbows shall be replaced.** Contractor shall also replace grouted floor as shown.

ARTICLE 1—OWNER AND BIDDER

1.01 This Bid is submitted to:

1.02 The undersigned Bidder proposes and agrees, if this Bid is accepted, to enter into an Agreement with Owner in the form included in the Bidding Documents to perform all Work as specified or indicated in the Bidding Documents for the prices and within the times indicated in this Bid and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Bidding Documents.

ARTICLE 2—ATTACHMENTS TO THIS BID

2.01 The following documents are submitted with and made a condition of this Bid:

- A. Required Bid security (Section 00460);
- B. Completed Section 00480 – Certification of Nonsegregated Facilities;
- C. Completed Section 00481 – Noncollusion Affidavit of Prime Bidder;
- D. Completed Section 00483 – Contractor Affidavit under OCGA 13-10-91(b)(3); and
- E. Completed Section 00486 – SAVE Affidavit.

2.02 The following documents will be submitted within seven (7) days after bidding and made a condition of this Bid:

- A. Completed Section 00470 – Qualifications of Bidder with supporting data;
- B. Evidence of authority to do business in the state of the Project or a written covenant to obtain such authority within the time for acceptance of Bids;
- C. Utility Contractor's License of the contractor performing the work or evidence of the Bidder's to obtain a Utility Contractor License within the time for acceptance of Bids;
- D. List of Project References;
- E. List of Proposed Subcontractors; and
- F. List of Proposed Supplier.

ARTICLE 3—TIME OF COMPLETION

- 3.01 Bidder agrees that the Work will be substantially complete and will be completed and ready for final payment in accordance with Paragraph 15.06 of the General Conditions on or before the dates or within the number of calendar days indicated in the Agreement.
- 3.02 Bidder accepts the provisions of the Agreement as to liquidated damages.

ARTICLE 4—BIDDER'S ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS: ACCEPTANCE PERIOD AND INSTRUCTIONS

- 4.01 *Bid Acceptance Period*
- A. This Bid will remain subject to acceptance for 60 days after the Bid opening, or for such longer period of time that Bidder may agree to in writing upon request of Owner.
- 4.02 *Instructions to Bidders*
- A. Bidder accepts all of the terms and conditions of the Instructions to Bidders, including without limitation those dealing with the disposition of Bid security.

ARTICLE 5—BASIS OF BID

- 5.01 Bidder will complete the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents for the price(s) as submitted on www.cartersloope.com/outforbid.

ARTICLE 6—BIDDER'S REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS

- 6.01 *Bidder's Representations*
- A. In submitting this Bid, Bidder represents the following:
1. Bidder has examined and carefully studied the Bidding Documents, including Addenda.
 2. Bidder has visited the Site, conducted a thorough visual examination of the Site and adjacent areas, and become familiar with the general, local, and Site conditions that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 3. Bidder is familiar with all Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, and performance of the Work.
 4. Bidder has carefully studied the reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or adjacent to the Site and the drawings of physical conditions relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to the Technical Data in such reports and drawings.
 5. Bidder has carefully studied the reports and drawings relating to Hazardous

Environmental Conditions, if any, at or adjacent to the Site that have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions, with respect to Technical Data in such reports and drawings.

6. Bidder has considered the information known to Bidder itself; information commonly known to contractors doing business in the locality of the Site; information and observations obtained from visits to the Site; the Bidding Documents; and the Technical Data identified in the Supplementary Conditions or by definition, with respect to the effect of such information, observations, and Technical Data on (a) the cost, progress, and performance of the Work; (b) the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by Bidder, if selected as Contractor; and (c) Bidder's (Contractor's) safety precautions and programs.
7. Based on the information and observations referred to in the preceding paragraph, Bidder agrees that no further examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times, and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract.
8. Bidder is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by Owner and others at the Site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Bidding Documents.
9. Bidder has given Engineer written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities, or discrepancies that Bidder has discovered in the Bidding Documents, and of discrepancies between Site conditions and the Contract Documents, and the written resolution thereof by Engineer is acceptable to Contractor.
10. The Bidding Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.
11. The submission of this Bid constitutes an incontrovertible representation by Bidder that without exception the Bid and all prices in the Bid are premised upon performing and furnishing the Work required by the Bidding Documents.

6.02 *Bidder's Certifications*

A. The Bidder certifies the following:

1. This Bid is genuine and not made in the interest of or on behalf of any undisclosed individual or entity and is not submitted in conformity with any collusive agreement or rules of any group, association, organization, or corporation.
2. Bidder has not directly or indirectly induced or solicited any other Bidder to submit a false or sham Bid.
3. Bidder has not solicited or induced any individual or entity to refrain from bidding.
4. Bidder has not engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, or coercive practices in competing for the Contract. For the purposes of this Paragraph 8.02.A:

BIDDER'S REPRESENTATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS

- a. Corrupt practice means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value likely to influence the action of a public official in the bidding process.
- b. Fraudulent practice means an intentional misrepresentation of facts made (a) to influence the bidding process to the detriment of Owner, (b) to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels, or (c) to deprive Owner of the benefits of free and open competition.
- c. Collusive practice means a scheme or arrangement between two or more Bidders, with or without the knowledge of Owner, a purpose of which is to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels.
- d. Coercive practice means harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence their participation in the bidding process or affect the execution of the Contract.
